18. The Story of Charles Edward Stone

Appears on Plaque as Alfred C Stone

- **Captain Charles Edward Stone** Royal Artillery Airlanding Light Regiment, (The Worcestershire Yeomanry) died 30th June 1944 age 24

53rd Airlanding Light Regiment 210, 212 Battery and the Regimental Hq arrived by sea in Normandy 14 June

Capt Stone commanded F Troop of the 212th Battery in the operation to seize the bridges over the River Orne and Caen Canal at Bénouville and Ranville.

. He was wounded at 2330 on the 29th June 1944 at his forward Observation Post and died of wounds the next day, age 25.
